

MUSIC MINOR

A minor is available to students who desire documented competency in music. An individualized curriculum (incorporating theory, history, and performance) based on the following guidelines is developed in consultation with a member of the music faculty. Students must complete one academic music lecture course at Cal Poly, such as MU 1101 (https://catalog.calpoly.edu/search/?P=MU%20101) or MU 1120 (https://catalog.calpoly.edu/search/?P=MU%20120), before applying for the minor. Information and application forms for the declaration of a Music minor are available in the Music Department Office, as well as online at the department website (https://music.calpoly.edu/).

Program Learning Objectives

- 1. Identify and analyze cultural frameworks in music, including issues related to diversity, social and economic inequities, and political power.
- 2. Identify and analyze musical elements and structures in various contexts.
- 3. Create music in various contexts.
- 4. Perform music in various contexts.
- 5. Implement relevant technology in musical activities.
- 6. Communicate effectively through and about music.

Minor Requirements and Curriculum

The minor must be completed prior to, or at the same time as, the requirements for the bachelor's degree. A major and a minor may not be taken in the same degree program, and a minor is not required for a degree. Requirements for the minor include:

- · At least half of the units must be from upper-division courses (3000-4000 level).
- · At least half of the units must be taken at Cal Poly (in residence).
- No more than one-third of the units will be taken with credit-no credit grading (CR/NC), not counting courses with mandatory CR/NC. Departments
 may further limit CR/NC grading if desired.
- · A minimum 2.0 GPA is required in all units counted for completion of the minor.
